I. Situation Overview

A. Weather Bulletin

According to the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) Tropical Cyclone Bulletin Nr. 5 (issued 5:00 pm), Typhoon Uwan (Fung-Wong) continues to rapidly intensify as it moves closer to the Philippine Sea, east of the Bicol Region. As of 4:00 PM today, November 8, 2025, the center of Typhoon Uwan was estimated at 575 km east of Catarman, Northern Samar or 620 km east of Virac, Catanduanes (12.9°N, 129.9°E). It carries maximum sustained winds of 150 km/h near the center, gustiness up to 185 km/h, and a central pressure of 955 hPa while moving west northwestward at 30 km/h. The typhoon's strong to typhoon-force winds extend outward up to 800 kilometers from the center.

Currently, Tropical Cyclone Wind Signals (TCWS) Nos. 1 to 3 are in effect across large portions of Luzon and Visayas. The province of Batangas is now under TCWS No. 1, where strong winds (39-61 km/h) may be experienced within the next 36 hours. This may result in minimal to minor threats to life and property, such as falling debris, light structural damage, and power interruptions, particularly in elevated and coastal areas.

According to PAGASA's latest track and intensity forecast, Typhoon Uwan is expected to pass close to Catanduanes by tomorrow morning (November 9) and may make landfall over the northern or central portion of Aurora by Sunday night or early Monday morning (November 9-10). After crossing Northern Luzon, it is forecast to emerge over the Lingayen Gulf or the coastal waters of Pangasinan or La Union on Monday. Uwan may continue to intensify further into a super typhoon before making

landfall, bringing heavy rainfall, severe winds, and storm surges across affected regions.

B. Rapid Assessment

Although Typhoon Uwan has not yet brought direct effects to the province of Batangas, the PSAC Coordinator of the Minor Basilica and Parish of the Immaculate Conception and the Archdiocesan Shrine of Sto. Niño ng Batangan has reported that forced evacuation is currently being carried out in four barangays located near the river and coastal areas. Residents are now being registered and accommodated in designated evacuation centers as part of precautionary measures and preparedness efforts for the possible impacts of Typhoon Uwan.

According to the PDRRMO Situation Report (SitRep) No. 1 Displaced Persons and Families in Evacuation Centers, which offers a transparency of displacement statistics as of November 8, 2025, at 5:00 PM. This document analytically lists the number of families and individuals seeking refuge within designated evacuation centers across various regions, provinces, and municipalities. It clearly shows that a grand total of 590 families and 2,112 individuals are currently housed in these centers. The data is organized by district, highlighting that District III has the highest number of displaced persons, while Districts IV, V, and VI report zero displacements in their respective areas at this time.

II. Response

The LASAC Emergency Operations Center (EOC) was officially activated to Blue Alert Status at 8:00 am of November 8, 2025, ensuring heightened readiness and mobilization of disaster response personnel and resources. Since then, real-time weather updates, along with emergency hotline numbers for all cities and municipalities in the province and precautionary measures postings, have been systematically posted on LASAC's Facebook page and disseminated via messenger groups. The EOC continuously monitors weather developments, issues timely warnings to the public, and prepares detailed situational report documenting all operational actions. Coordination efforts remain strong, with active engagement between LASAC and the PSAC Coordinator in monitoring community situations.

III. Coordination

LASAC continues coordinating with parishes through PSAC Coordinators for monitoring the situations likewise the parish is in coordination with their local government unit for the possible augmentation to the response.

The Office of the Archbishop ensured close coordination with the Social Communications Commission and the Radyo Bayanihan System
