I. Situation Overview

A. Weather Bulletin

According to the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA), Typhoon UWAN intensified into a Super Typhoon at 8:00 AM today, November 9, 2025. As of 10:00 PM, November 9, 2025, the center of the eye of Super Typhoon UWAN was estimated in the vicinity of Kasibu, Nueva Vizcaya. The Super Typhoon now carries maximum sustained winds of 185 km/h near the center, with gustiness up to 230 km/h, and a central pressure of 935 hPa, while moving Northwestward at 30 km/h. The destructive typhoon-force winds extend outwards up to 900 kilometers from the center.

TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS (TCWS) are currently in effect across large portions of Luzon, Visayas, and Palawan. TCWS No. 5, signifying Typhoon-force winds (185 km/h or higher) and an Extreme threat to life and property, is in effect over the southern portion of Quirino, southeastern Nueva Vizcaya, northeastern Nueva Ecija, and the northern and central portion of Aurora. The province of Batangas is now under TCWS No. 3, where Storm-force winds (89-117 km/h) posing a Moderate to significant threat to life and property may be experienced within the next 18 hours. Other areas under TCWS No. 3 include Metro Manila, Cavite, Laguna, Rizal, Bataan, and parts of Quezon and Camarines Norte. TCWS No. 4, 2, and 1 are also in effect over various other regions of Luzon and Visayas.

Hazard Outlooks are severe, a high risk of life-threatening and damaging storm surge with peak heights exceeding 3.0 meters is expected within the next 48 hours over low-lying coastal communities across Ilocos Region, Cagayan Valley, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, MIMAROPA, and portions of the Visayas and Mindanao. Additionally, sea travel is risky for all types of vessels over most seaboard

due to extremely high seas, with wave heights potentially reaching up to 14.0 meters in the seaboard of Isabela, Aurora, and Camarines Norte.

UWAN made landfall over Dinalungan, Aurora, at 9:10 PM tonight and will traverse the mountainous terrain of Northern Luzon, emerging over Lingayen Gulf or the coastal waters of La Union or Ilocos Sur tomorrow morning (November 10). While terrain interaction is expected to cause some weakening, the system is forecast to remain a Typhoon throughout its passage over Northern Luzon. It will then turn Northwestward to Northward on Monday and Tuesday, before turning Northeastward towards the Taiwan Strait on Wednesday (November 12).

B. Rapid Assessment

Super Typhoon UWAN began its impact on Batangas Province by noon of November 9, 2025. Timely reports from MSS and PSAC Coordinators confirmed the onset of strong winds and heavy rains across the affected areas throughout the afternoon. The primary immediate impact was a widespread power outage affecting most areas of Batangas Province, including the LASAC EOC which lost its power supply at 5:30 PM. To maintain critical monitoring and coordination, the LASAC EOC implemented a swift contingency plan by temporarily relocating to the St. Francis Major Seminary lobby at 8:00 PM to utilize their available internet and power supply. Full EOC operations were restored at 10:15 PM following the resumption of power supply.

Based on consolidated data from MSS, PSAC Coordinators and PDRRMO situational reports, a significant increase on reports of affected individuals were recorded: a total of 160 evacuation centers is currently open across the province, accommodating 5,473 families (19,081 individuals). Additionally, 282 families (818 individuals) have volunteered to self-evacuate and are currently situated outside formal centers, indicating a critical need for immediate support and monitoring of over 19, 899 displaced individuals.

II. Response

The LASAC Emergency Operations Center (EOC) remains activated at Blue Alert Status, now entering its second day of continuous operation since 8:00 AM on November 8, 2025, ensuring the sustained mobilization of response personnel and resources. Response efforts have included the continuous dissemination of real-time weather updates, emergency hotline numbers for all cities and municipalities, and precautionary measures through the LASAC Facebook page and messenger groups. The EOC maintains 24-hour monitoring of weather developments, issues timely public warnings, and prepares detailed Situational Reports documenting all operational actions. Coordination efforts remain strong, with active engagement between LASAC and PSAC Coordinators ensuring real-time ground-level situation monitoring. Furthermore, communication efforts were bolstered by the release of a Pastoral audio message from Archbishop Gilbert Garcera via the Archdiocese of Lipa Facebook Page,

providing guidance for the preparation on the anticipated effects of the super typhoon.

In the field, the Parish of Sto. Niño in Marawoy, Lipa City, and St. Francis Xavier Parish in Nasugbu have opened their parish facilities as evacuation centers for families displaced or seeking refuge from the effects of the storm. Meanwhile, representatives from St. Therese of the Child Jesus Parish in Talisay, Lipa visited the LASAC EOC to request gallon containers of water intended for evacuees currently housed at Dagatan Elementary School.

III. Coordination


